Njala University, Sierra Leone

Experiential learning is the core of the International Development and Agribusiness Program (IDAP) in Sierra Leone. IDAP is the opportunity of a lifetime to study international development in English while experiencing and living in a rich West African culture. The program puts you in direct contact with the social and economic realities of actual students and communities and of people working within them to address complex issues. The program is part of a historical collaborative effort between the University of Illinois and the Njala University in Sierra Leone and some courses will include Niala University's Agribusiness Management honors students. Through classes, field trips, internships and service learning, this semester long experience strives to establish a continual dialogue linking experience with theory and critical analysis. Students from a variety of disciplines— aariculture, social sciences, African Studies, natural resources and environmental sciences, business, global studies are encouraged to participate in this program.



Learn from both Illinois and Njala Faculty

Faculty from both the University of Illinois and Njala University will serve as instructors.

Sierra Leone

Njala University was established in 1964 with assistance from the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the University of Illinois. During Sierra Leone's brutal civil war, Njala University relocated from rural Njala to urban Freetown in 1994. The University has responded well to the challenges that it has been facing, and has grown to become among the leading Universities of Sierra Leone.

Accommodations

You will be staying in student housing living alongside students from Njala's Agribusiness major. Students will have private non-air conditioned rooms with shared bathrooms. Three meals a day will be provided for students.

Language

The official language of Sierra Leone is English. Other major languages include Mende (principal vernacular in the south), Temne (principal vernacular in the north) and Krio, an English-based Creole, spoken by the descendants of freed slaves from the United States and Jamaica who were settled in the Freetown area.

Eligibility

To participate on the program you must be a UIUC undergraduate and have a GPA of at least 2.75 and be In your sophomore, junior or senior year.

Program Cost

Total semester costs for this program are estimated at \$15,700.

Scholarships
